The Year in Review



80TH SWCS INTERNATIONAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The 2025 conference brought together more than

300 conservationists representing

5 countries and

41 states.

The conference program included

152 presentations,2 tours, and 1 workshop.



EMERGING LEADERS PROGRAM

The 2025 class of the Emerging Leaders Program graduated in August!

128 leaders hosted

109 events with

6,922 attendees and

283 partner organizations.

SWCS welcomed **195** participants into the 2026 class in September.



JOURNAL OF SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION

The JSWC published

40+ papers from studies across

4 continents,

led by our team of editors who represent

14 countries around the world.



CHAPTER ACTION

SWCS chapters continue advancing conservation locally.

4 new student chapters were added to our network of

40+ chapters in the US and Canada. We recruited

380+ new members, and chapters continue increasing the number of local events held each year.

The Year in Review



Enhancing Conservation Capacity

82% of respondents identified a medium or high need for greater capacity to provide farmers and landowners with technical assistance.

49% of respondents indicated a high need for improved onboarding and training for new employees, reflecting staffing and resource challenges.



Streamlining Processes



90% of respondents rated streamlining contracting processes as "helpful" or "very helpful," aligning with frustrations over cumbersome paperwork and inefficiencies.

Climate-Smart Agriculture

62% of respondents were comfortable providing technical assistance on climate-smart agriculture, a significant increase from 37% in 2021.

Job Satisfaction & Challenges

reported being satisfied with their jobs most or all of the time, citing direct work with farmers, marking observable impacts on the environment and their community, and working in teams and collaborations as highlights.

Practitioners highlighted 3 major challenges in their work: excessive paperwork and process complexity, limited human and financial resources, and the ineffectiveness of programs coupled with insufficient progress.


